Merrick Garland was unanimously approved and found well qualified by the American Bar Association, however, due to the Republican control of the Judiciary Committee and the racism leveled at President Obama, Mr. Garland was not given an opportunity to present his qualifications to advance for a vote from the full senate. This was the first time since the Civil War that a nominee to the U.S. Supreme Court had not received full consideration. He is a man who has spent the majority of his career in public interest and who is qualified.
